- Write very simple texts about family topics

- Read simple descriptions and narratives
- Write simple sentences giving information

- Deliver simple presentations in English
- Read simple biographies and narratives
- Write simple informal emails

LEVEL 3

- Listen to texts about familiar topics
- Deliver simple presentations in English
- Read simple biographies and narratives
- Write informative informal emails

- Read informative and persuasive texts
- Write comparing and contrasting essays
